Father Kevin's Desk

Following a demanding week last week with funerals every day, I am pleased to say that this week we have none. Conducting a funeral is an obvious regular event in the life of a priest and is always given top priority. It is also a great opportunity for evangelisation and for families to connect with the church especially if they have been away for a while.

It might surprise you to know that the average time most priests spend on each funeral is between five and seven hours. This includes the first meeting with the family and all the preparation involved. One reason for being grateful for no funerals this week is that I have been asked to spend two days in the Archdiocese helping with interviews for six new posts. The posts in question are 'Pastoral Associates.' This is a new initiative to employ six pastoral workers who will be deployed across the Archdiocese assisting the local parishes. The role of each pastoral associate will vary depending on the specific needs of the deanery that they will serve. Each deanery that has requested a Pastoral Associate will be responsible for their funding and each post will be guaranteed for a minimum of three years. I believe this is a great move forward and please God, will reap fruitful rewards in the future. I am sure that more information will follow as the role of these new pastoral workers is defined but in the meantime, as we seek to find the right people, please keep this initiative in your prayers. And as we continue to work together to build up the Church, let me close with this quote from Archbishop Oscar Romero who is being canonised a saint on Sunday.

Brothers and sisters, we don't measure the church by the number of people, nor do we measure the church by its material buildings. The church has built many temples, many seminaries, and many buildings. The material walls remain and become part of history. What matters are all of you, the men and women, the hearts, the grace of God giving you truth and the life of God. Don't measure worth by counting how many are in the crowd, count the sincerity of the heart with which they follow his truth and the grace of our Divine Saviour.
