### Father Kevin's Desk

This weekend will be the first time those who have been shielding for over four months will eventually be allowed a little more freedom. I am sure we all recognise that this horrendous virus has affected everyone but perhaps we do not always appreciate how severely it has affected some people more than others. For those living alone and shielding and without the use of the internet the days must have been extremely long with an ever increasing sense of isolation. Hopefully even with the continued threat, future lockdowns will not prove so severe and as we continue to share our experiences, it would be great if we as 'church' may have learned some valuable lessons and be even better prepared to help those most vulnerable in the future.

In light of these very strange and challenging months and given how bad the situation remains in some countries, St. Paul provides us with some spiritual wisdom and much needed encouragement in today's second reading;

Nothing can come between us and the love of Christ, even if we are troubled or worried, or being persecuted, or lacking food or clothing, or being threatened or even attacked. These are the trials through which we triumph, by the power of him who loved us.

For I am certain of this: neither death nor life, no angel, no prince, nothing that exists, nothing still to come, not any power, or height or depth, nor any created thing, can ever come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord.

What an incredibly powerful statement this is. St. Paul however is not simply expressing a theological statement he is speaking from the heart and from his own very personal experiences. Since his conversion to Christianity and becoming a leader he has had many hardships to endure which he states in his second letter to the Corinthians, these include; being in prisoned many times, being whipped three times by the Romans and five times receiving thirty nine lashes from the Jewish courts, he was once stoned in the streets, was shipwrecked three times even spending twenty four hours in the water, in addition to many other setbacks and challenges.

God certainly did not make it easy for him and nor for us at times, however, Paul remained resolute despite the hardships or crosses and viewed them all as a means of growing closer to

Christ. May we likewise grow through our sufferings and remain steadfast like St. Paul that we too will not allow anything to ever come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord......Amen.
