Faith in Focus

There should be a law about it


Politicians know that to be successful they have to convince us they would pass better laws in the main areas such as: education, health, transport, security and earnings. Everything else just comes and goes.

Even though most of us don't like laws (we'd prefer fewer rather than more), we do recognise that they can be useful in regulating life for the common good. So we elect people to make laws that promote fairness and foster harmony in society.

The Jewish people were famous for their laws; they seemed to have one for every occasion. But when they were deported to Babylon in Iraq in exile, the new generations lost touch with their legal system. Upon their return to Jerusalem Ezra gathered them into an assembly and read the whole of the Law to them. They cried and wept, not because the laws were harsh, but because they showed the allencompassing care that God had for them in setting up this legal system. That's why the psalmist sang about the Law of God being perfect and gladdening the heart.

All the Old Testament laws come to fulfilment in Christ. The wisdom of

God once encased in legal codes is now distilled in the person of Jesus. And when we



Unlike man-made laws, the law of God is not intended to be a burden to people. It's intended to set them free to get on with life. God's law is ordered in such a way that the innate goodness and beauty of human life should be shared by all to the maximum. It encourages growth rather than restricts; it offers freedom rather than a straight-jacket. It looks at the whole picture rather than the interest of the moment.

So when Jesus says that the law and prophets are about to be fulfilled, what does he say will happen? The poor will get some good news, prisoners will be given their liberty, the blind will see again and oppressed people will be set free. If there's a politician out there, your time may be running out...
