

This story, and the response of Jesus, has come - rightly or wrongly - to form the foundation stone of many Catholic social justice programmes. Whether it's the desired-for separation of Christian society and the state, the separation of theology from economics, or simply the justification for radical social action, almost everyone has their own particular take on this biblical moment of entrapment and intrigue.
